## **Steyning Horseshoe**

Distance: 2.8 miles
Undulating terrain and long
downhill section.
No stiles

This walk starts in the town centre then takes you into the countryside through woodland along the waymarked nature trail.

If you are feeling fit you can take a longer route (not described). This is a very steep climb up the hill, but well worth it for the views. At point 3 you will see a blue arrow next to the yellow arrow. You can follow this route up and over the hill to meet with the yellow arrows of this walk at point 4. Good luck!



Park at the Steyning Centre and follow the route past the bottom of the High Street and out of town.

- 1. At the Steyning Centre take the footpath on the right of the centre into School Lane. At the end of this lane turn left into Church Street.
- 2. Leaving Church Street cross straight across the High Street at the mini roundabout. Proceed up Sheep Pen Lane and Newham Lane. Ignore the turning to the right after about 100 metres which turns into Charlton Street, but carry on straight ahead along the raised pavement on the right-hand-side. This is a long stretch, approximately half a mile. The pavement disappears after a while but keep on the right-hand-side. Ignore the footpath on the right about halfway along. At the end of all the houses the lane will narrow.
- 3. Opposite the White House on your left you will see the blue arrow of the Nature Trail route on the footpath signpost. After about 25 metres follow the yellow arrows to the right through the woods. Pass through the wooden kissing gate and follow the undulating terrain around the horseshoe. The bench about half-way round this section is a good place to stop for a break. Along the rest of the route the path will lead you through a hurdle and another kissing gate.
- **4**. After this second kissing gate you reach an open space. Turn right at the T-junction following the yellow arrows. You're now going downhill. This is where the blue route meets up with the yellow route. The footpath continues for another half a mile leading back into the town centre.
