

# a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

The management of the premises will ensure all licensing objectives as detailed below are strictly observed and enforced

There will be no promotions that encourage illegal, irresponsible or immoderate consumption.

#### b) The prevention of crime and disorder

All staff members engaged, or to be engaged, in selling alcohol on the premises shall receive full training pertinent to the Licensing Act, specifically in regards to agerestricted products, and the refusal of sales to persons believed to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Induction training must be completed prior to engaging in any sale of alcohol.

Refresher training shall be conducted thereafter at intervals of no more than sixteen (16)weeks (this may be verbal training).

All restricted sales training undertaken by staff members shall be fully documented and signed by the employee and a trustee member. All training records shall be made available upon request to an officer of a Responsibly Authority.

The premises shall at all times maintain and operate a sales refusals log and an incident log will be kept to record all refusals and incidents of crime or disorder. These shall be reviewed and signed off by a trusted member of management at intervals of no more than four (4) weeks.

Feedback shall be given to staff to ensure these are used on each occasion that a refusal or incident occurs at the premises. These records shall be kept for a minimum of twenty four (24) months, and made available upon request to an officer of a Responsibly Authority.

#### c) Public safety

Refusing the sale of alcohol to a person who is drunk

CCTV shall be recording at all times with recordings kept for at least 30 days Recordings will be made available to the Police upon request and at no cost to the Police

Any staff employed for the sale of alcohol will be trained with a record of the training kept and made available upon reasonable request by a responsible

Refresher training will take place every six months with a record kept and made available upon reasonable request by a responsible authority

Fire safety measures will be installed and maintained.

Staff will be trained in first aid. Adequate and appropriate first aid equipment and materials will be kept on site

An annual assessment and a risk assessment of fire safety will be conducted and a record kept ready for inspection

#### d) The prevention of public nuisance

No known issues at present but should a genuine issue be raised we will take prompt action to rectify the issue and the premises and immediate surrounding areas will be kept clean and free from litter at all times the premises are open

#### e) The protection of children from harm

The premises will operate an age verification policy set at a minimum of 25 years, whereby any person attempting to buy alcohol who appears to be under the specified age will be asked for photographic ID to prove their age.

Signage advertising the "Challenge" policy will be displayed in prominent locations in the premises and shall include the point of sale and the area where the alcohol is displayed, as a minimum.

    - does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
    - is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have the right to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

They do this in one of two ways:

- by providing with this application, copies or scanned copies of the documents which an applicant has provided, to demonstrate their entitlement to work in the UK (which do not need to be certified) as per information published on gov.uk and in guidance.
- by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

Home Office online right to work checking service.

As an alternative to providing a copy of original documents, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at <a href="https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work">https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work</a>) which, along with the applicant's date of birth, will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

An online check will not be possible in all circumstances because not all applicants will have an immigration status that can be shared digitally. The Home Office online right to work checking service sets out what information and/or documentation applicants will need in order to access the service. Applicants who are unable to obtain a share code from the service should submit copies of documents as set out above.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.
