Ashington Neighbourhood Development Plan

In light of recent announcements regarding COVID-19 Horsham District Council has reviewed its protocols regarding the consultation process for neighbourhood plans, a number of which were published for public consultation shortly before the government imposed the nationwide lockdown.

In order to continue to progress neighbourhood plans, we have made a decision to restart with the consultation process with measures we feel are in accordance to the government guidelines.

Ashington Parish Council has prepared a Neighbourhood Development Plan (ANP). The Plan sets out a vision for the future of the parish and planning policies which will be used to determine planning applications locally. In accordance with Regulation 16 of the Neighbourhood Planning Regulations 2012 (as amended), the ANP and associated documents will go out to consultation:

Wednesday 17 June to Wednesday 12 August 2020 for 8 weeks inviting representations on the draft submission plan, basic conditions statement, consultation statement and the full Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA).

- **Church Lane is too narrow to cope with this extra traffic**
- **There is already too much traffic on Church Lane with cars parked often on both sides. An additional number of cars and associated parking problems, would severely impact accessibility.**
- **Church lane already has speed humps, slowing traffic speed, causing a further build up of traffic**
- **The traffic survey was completed during the end of lockdown, when the school was closed. The Ashington community centre is currently out of use due to Covid 19 therefore any results would be inaccurate. The survey HAS to be done during school time and when the community centre is fully open.**
- **The Church is a heritage sight, which would be ruined by the proposed plan. ALTERNATIVE ACCESS ROUTES SHOULD BE CONSIDERED.**
- **The Church is very well attended and extremely busy on Sunday's (religious services) and throughout the week, also weddings. With the obvious lack of parking this will cause an issue.**
- **A building development alongside a building of worship is absolutely not acceptable.**
- **The school is oversubscribed (CURRENTLY a waiting list). Where will the children living in these new houses be educated? As the housing developments proposed location restricts any building extension to the school.**
- **There is no doctor's surgery in Ashington, Glebe Surgery Storrington is already very busy, they cannot cater for this many more people.**
- **Limited parking at Community Centre, School, Recreation ground is ALREADY causing people to park dangerously on the grass verges in Church Close.**
- **The Co-op/post office car park is ridiculously overcrowded with dangerous parking. The volume of**

PEOPLE going to the Co-op results in long queues to even get into the store.

- **Increased noise pollution.**
- **Increased air pollution with increased vehicle usage. (Av. 2 cars per household, minimum 500 cars).**
- **House prices in Church Close would be negatively impacted.**

What improvements or modifications would you suggest?

- **Look at an alternative site.**
- **The proposed access road alongside the Church is completely unacceptable and needs relocating and would be a main road outside my house.**
