Chapter 2: Duty-to-Cooperate

2.1. The Localism Act 2011 and the National Planning Policy Framework 2021¹ place a 'Duty to Co-operate' on local planning authorities and other prescribed bodies to address strategic planning issues relevant to their areas in the preparation of their local plans and other planning documents and to work together on such issues. Horsham District Council is obliged to determine what work needs to be done at a strategic level and in doing so decide how to work with neighbouring authorities to bring forward the required levels of growth. It is a legal requirement that where local authorities have worked together under the Duty to Co-operate mechanism, that the Monitoring Report provides details of the actions that have taken place during the monitoring period.

Duty-to-Cooperate Mechanisms

2.2. The Duty to Co-operate requires cross-boundary discussions with a range of local authorities, both adjoining and beyond the boundary of Horsham District. There are a number of different groups with whom Horsham District has a relationship. These are set out in Table 1 below. These groups meet on a regular basis to discuss the requirements of local authorities, and how these may be met across the sub-region.

- 2.4 The Duty to Co-operate is an ongoing process and regular discussions and meetings are held with a wide range of organisations in order to support the preparation of the Local Plan. The most significant cross boundary issue facing Horsham District during 2022 and 2023 has been the requirement to ensure that the new local plan is Water Neutral. Following significant joint working with a wide range of local authorities and other partners, such as Natural England and Southern Water, a Mitigation Strategy was published in December 2022.
