Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

Our venue is a small, 200-capacity music and events space located within an industrial unit in Horsham, directly opposite our brewery. We intend to operate as a safe, well-managed space for live music, comedy, plays, community events, and private functions. Events will be ticketed or held under private hire arrangements to ensure we maintain full control of entry and attendance. We are committed to running the venue responsibly, working closely with Horsham District Council, local residents, and neighbouring businesses to ensure our activities are well-managed and conducted in accordance with all licensing conditions.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

We will put in place robust measures to deter crime and disorder within and around the premises. All events will be staffed by trained personnel, and registered security will be deployed if required. A Challenge 25 policy will be strictly enforced, and only trained staff will serve alcohol from our small bar. CCTV will cover all public areas, entrances, and exits, with footage retained in accordance with local licensing requirements. We will maintain close communication with local police, authorities, and neighbouring businesses to ensure that any emerging concerns are promptly addressed.

c) Public safety

Public safety is central to the design and operation of the venue. The capacity will be strictly limited to 200 people, and clear emergency exits, signage, and evacuation procedures will be in place and maintained. The premises will be kept in good structural and operational condition, with regular fire safety checks, risk assessments, and equipment testing (including fire alarms, extinguishers, and emergency lighting). All staff will receive training in safe operation, crowd management, and incident response. We will ensure that the venue is clean, accessible, and compliant with all health and safety regulations at all times.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

We will actively manage noise, disturbance, and general nuisance to ensure we operate responsibly within the local community. As the venue is located in an industrial area, disruption to residents is naturally minimised; however, we will still implement strong measures to control sound levels, including keeping doors and windows closed during loud performances and using a sound-limiting the PA system when required. Patrons will be encouraged to arrive and leave quietly, with clear signage reminding them to respect our neighbours. Waste will be managed responsibly, and events will be scheduled and supervised to prevent excessive noise or activity outside the premises. We are committed to working constructively with local businesses and the council to address any concerns.

e) The protection of children from harm

We are committed to ensuring that children are protected from harm while on the premises. As a general rule, children will only be permitted when appropriate to the nature of the event and under the supervision of a responsible adult. For events where alcohol is sold, a strict Challenge 25 policy will be in place, and staff will receive training on identifying and preventing underage sales. No child will be allowed in areas restricted for safety, such as backstage or equipment zones. Where events are specifically family-friendly, safeguarding considerations will be included in the event risk assessment, and a nominated staff member will oversee child safety for that session. We will always follow statutory guidance and work with authorities to ensure our practices remain compliant and effective.

- 8. If you wish people to be able to consume alcohol on the premises, please tick 'on the premises'. If you wish people to be able to purchase alcohol to consume away from the premises, please tick 'off the premises'. If you wish people to be able to do both, please tick 'both'.
- 9. Please give information about anything intended to occur at the premises or ancillary to the use of the premises which may give rise to concern in respect of children, regardless of whether you intend children to have access to the premises, for example (but not exclusively) nudity or semi-nudity, films for restricted age groups or the presence of gaming machines.
- Please list here steps you will take to promote all four licensing objectives together.
- 11. The application form must be signed.
- 12. An applicant's agent (for example solicitor) may sign the form on their behalf provided that they have actual authority to do so.
- 13. Where there is more than one applicant, each of the applicants or their respective agent must sign the application form.
- 14. This is the address which we shall use to correspond with you about this application.
- 15. Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:
- A licence may not be issued to an individual or an individual in a partnership which is not a limited liability partnership who is resident in the UK who:
 - does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
 - is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have the right to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

They do this in one of two ways:

- by providing with this application, copies or scanned copies of the documents which an applicant has provided, to demonstrate their entitlement to work in the UK (which do not need to be certified) as per information published on gov.uk and in guidance.
- by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

Home Office online right to work checking service.

As an alternative to providing a copy of original documents, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work) which, along with the applicant's date of birth, will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

An online check will not be possible in all circumstances because not all applicants will have an immigration status that can be shared digitally. The Home Office online right to work checking service sets out what information and/or documentation applicants will need in order to access the service. Applicants who are unable to obtain a share code from the service should submit copies of documents as set out above.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.
