When drovers lane was built in 2013, an area of orphaned land was left which shows as a white space immediately between the 5 bungalows of drovers lane and the north/south

bridlepath. Who owns this land and what is it going to be used for?

If this is used as an access road onto Glebelands it would cause serious problems for the existing residents of this end of Glebelands who rely on the existing cu-de-sac for parking.

Even if this orphaned plot of land was used for "social" housing, the same comment applies. There is a serious parking problem at this end of Glebelands even now.

If you build 170 houses here then statistically at least half the daily car movements

will be leaving and returning via New Place road/A29, moving via Spinney North and Link lane and past the School entrance. These roads are already a *nightmare* to navigate during the school run. New Place road is CURVED, it has NO SIGHTLINES, vehicles heading towards the A29 only have 1 traffic lane (because there are too many parked cars) and enter a blind section without knowing what is coming eastwards. The only solution would be to widen the existing single track access road to New Place Nurseries (past the allotments) and have a new mini roundabout at the junction of New Place Road and the A29. Why is there no mention of this problem in the document?. Have the authors of this document actually tried driving westwards down Spinney North, along Link Lane and then along New Place Road during the school run ??. I guess not. If they imagine that all the cars will use the Glebelands/A283/Lower Street exit then they need a reality check. Or do they imagine that all these vehicles will go east to the White ?? pub and then up to the A29 via the Toat Level Crossing. Both routes are "unsustainable".

What improvements or modifications would you suggest?

Imperative that a clear statement of how all the vehicles that will be moved to and from the 170

houses planned for North of Glebelands on New Place Nurseries will enter and leave and find their way onto the A29, as at least half of them will need to.

A *clear* statement of what is planned for the orphaned piece of land that was left after the 13 houses+ bungalows in Drovers Lane were built.
