Introductions

Introductions were made.

Actions from Last Meeting.

Updates on actions were provided.

Air Quality Monitoring 2022/2023.

TD shared NO2 monitoring data from 2022 and estimates for 2023 which show that the worst location's measurements (Manleys Hill) are below the Government objective. The question of "undeclaring" was raised but this was considered premature as 3 years of verified data showing no exceedance would be required and the Government objectives could be altered. It was also recognised that particulate matter remains an issue as even low levels are potentially harmful. It was suggested that modelling should continue to show adherence to Government objectives until 2027 to satisfy Defra.

Storrington Monitoring Station redecoration.

The station cabinet is being replaced to comply with Environment Agency's safety requirements.

Update of Horsham District Air Quality Action Plan / Defra Air Quality Grant.

A bid had been made to Defra to fund a monitoring campaign to improve the evidence base to measure NO2 levels on an hourly basis and for an ANPR survey to understand the contribution of through traffic to those levels. This survey would also provide information about the number of HGVs and HGVs over 7.5 tonne travelling through the AQMA. The bid should be decided by February 2024.
